Nursing associates are health and care staff who work in nursing teams in England.

the professionals on our register



everyone who uses our services




people who use health and care services.

How we made this plan



We looked at the law and all the information we have about including everyone and treating people equally and fairly. We used this to make our plan.



This includes information other people have given us.

There are 10 main areas in our plan



 We'll get better at collecting information about who people are and using it to make sure everyone is treated fairly, equally and included.



2. We'll make sure we work on where we know there is a problem.



3. We'll work with people who know a lot, have different ideas and have different experiences. We'll decide what to do together.



4. We'll help our leaders get better at making sure everyone is treated equally, fairly and included. And we'll help them take more responsibility for this.



5. We'll help everyone who works at the NMC get better at making sure people are treated equally and fairly.



6. We'll get better at using the things people are telling us to make decisions.



7. When we find out anyone we work with is being treated unfairly or differently we'll try to change that.



8. We'll help professionals to make sure everyone gets the good healthcare that they need.



9. We'll make sure that the people in charge of our work on equality check it in a better way.



10. Some of the laws that tell us how we must work are going to change to help us work in a better way. When this happens, we'll make sure treating people equally, fairly and including everyone is part of everything that we do.
