Summary

Summary of modification request

De Montfort University (DMU) school of nursing and midwifery (the school) has an established record of delivering the specialist practitioner qualification district nursing (SPQ DN) with the mandatory integrated nurse prescribing (V100) programme. The academic level seven Postgraduate Diploma and MSc District Nursing with NMC SPQ and V100 nurse prescribing programme was approved by the NMC on 8 January 2013. The NMC approved a major modification on 28 April 2016 to include an academic level six BSc (Hons) Nursing - District Nursing with NMC SPQ and V100 nurse prescribing programme to meet the increased demand for district nurses required by local practice learning partners (PLPs).

The mandatory integrated V100 nurse prescribing is delivered at academic level six only; it's a non-credit bearing module. The V100, alongside the other school prescribing provision, was reviewed at an NMC approval event on 24 May 2019 to meet the Standards framework for nursing and midwifery education (SFNME), (NMC 2018), Standards for student supervision and assessment (SSSA), (NMC 2018), Standards for prescribing programmes (SPP), (NMC, 2018), and Standards of proficiency for nurse and midwife prescriber (adoption of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society (RPS) competency framework for all prescribers) (NMC, 2018). The prescribing programme including the V100 was recommended to the NMC for approval on 28 June 2019. At the time of writing this report the programme leader confirmed that final written NMC approval has not yet been received.

This proposed major modification to the SPQ DN programme is to review the transfer from the Standards to support learning and assessment in practice (SLAiP) (NMC, 2008) to the SSSA (NMC, 2018) and align it with the V100 programme.

The aims and intended learning outcomes of the approved programme continue to reflect the NMC standards for specialist practice (NMC, 2001) and the integrated V100 prescribing qualification (NMC, 2018). There's evidence of consultation with practice learning partners (PLPs) on the proposed change.

The modification is recommended to the NMC for approval subject to two conditions.

What we found:

The length and content are unchanged since original approval on 8 January 2013 and major modification on 28 April 2016.

There's evidence of the programme team meeting with PLPs to discuss the proposed transfer to the SSSA. However, the programme documentation doesn't detail how practice assessors, supervisors and academic assessors are prepared to meet the SSSA requirements to supervise and assess students undertaking the SPQ DN programme. Existing practice teachers will undertake the practice assessor role; practice supervisors are identified as NMC qualified district nurses and experienced members of community nursing teams.

Discussion with the programme leader confirms there's a process in place to prepare practice assessors, supervisors and academic assessors. A two-hour preparation workshop in the programme induction week includes a detailed update on the SSSA roles and requirements. The preparation update workshop will be recorded and posted on the virtual DMU placement hub for practice assessors and supervisors to access who can't attend the workshop. The programme team is currently developing the DMU placement hub to include a SPQ DN resource area to support the new arrangements for practice learning.

The programme leader described how the programme team have engaged in the pan Midlands, Yorkshire and east practice learning group (MYE PLG) which provides a region-wide approach to preparation for academic staff. This includes online content, staff meetings and an online discussion board approach to preparation for the academic assessor role. However, the detail related to this isn't clearly detailed in the programme documentation.

There's no evidence of how practice assessors, supervisors and academic





assessors are prepared to support and assess students on the SPQ DN programme; the process must be explicitly detailed in the programme documentation. (Condition one)

Documentary evidence confirms that changes have been made to programme documentation to meet the SSSA requirements. Practice assessors, practice supervisors and academic assessors are responsible for supporting students in the practice learning environment. The programme documentation clearly details their associated roles. Evidence of practice learning and the progression towards achievement of the programme learning outcomes is recorded in a tracker portfolio. This supplements a practice assessment document (PAD) used to record achievement of the practice outcomes. The practice supervisor is responsible for ensuring students have exposure to learning opportunities to meet programme learning outcomes and competencies. This includes ensuring service user and carer feedback on student performance is received and recorded in the tracker portfolio.

There's evidence that the practice supervisor, practice assessor and academic assessor document students' progress and are involved in confirming that the practice competencies are achieved.

The programme leader confirmed the practice assessor and practice supervisor will meet with the student at an initial meeting to identify learning needs; progression is reviewed at mid-point in the programme. The academic assessor meets with the student and practice assessor at a final summative tripartite to confirm the student has met the requirements of the programme. The programme documentation including the practice assessor and supervisor handbook doesn't clearly and consistently detail how student progress and feedback is communicated between practice supervisors and assessors and the academic assessor. There must be a consistent approach which ensures a sound communication process and details are provided about how communication is operationalised between the practice supervisors, practice assessors and the academic assessor. (Condition two)

One student who's undertaking the part-time SPQ DN programme will transfer to SSSA in year two. The programme leader confirmed that the student and practice assessor have been consulted about the proposed change; email evidence confirms they have been invited to a preparation meeting to ensure they are clear about the proposed change.
