Summary

Summary of modification request

Manchester Metropolitan University (MMU) department of nursing has an established record of delivering the specialist practitioner qualification district nursing (SPQ DN) with the mandatory integrated nurse prescribing (V100) programme. The academic levels six and seven Postgraduate Diploma and BSc (Hons) Community Health with NMC SPQ and V100 nurse prescribing programme were approved by the NMC on 18 December 2017.

This proposed major modification to the SPQ DN with integrated V100 programme is to review the transfer from the Standards to support learning and assessment in practice (SLAiP) (NMC, 2008) to the Standards for student supervision and assessment (SSSA) (NMC, 2018).

The aims and intended learning outcomes of the approved programme continue to reflect the NMC standards for specialist practice (NMC, 2001) and the integrated V100 prescribing qualification (NMC, 2006). There's evidence of consultation with practice learning partners (PLPs) on the proposed change.

The modification is recommended to the NMC for approval. One recommendation is made.

What we found:

The length and content are unchanged since original approval on 18 December 2017.

There's evidence of the programme team meeting with PLPs to discuss the proposed transfer to the SSSA. District nursing (DN) service leads and practice assessors attend a briefing session detailing the transfer to SSSA. The programme team has developed a manager information document which further supports preparation for the roles. The senior academic lead confirms the SSSA will be reinforced at a practice supervisor and practice assessor briefing day at the start of the programme and two subsequent meetings during the academic year.

There's a range of methods demonstrating how practice assessors, practice supervisors and academic assessors are prepared for their roles across the NMC provision. MMU has engaged in the greater Manchester (GM) practice education group regional approach to SSSA. This is evidenced in the programme documentation and demonstrates commitment to a robust approach to the preparation of practice assessors, practice supervisors and academic assessors. A factsheet details how the preparation for all NMC programmes are supported. Current practice teachers and sign-off mentors must demonstrate how they meet the SSSA requirements using self-declaration forms which detail the requirements of each role and how preparation is undertaken. Academic staff are required to self-declare meeting the requirements of SSSA. The GM regional practice assessor and practice supervisor handbook supports the roles; programme specific information is detailed in the programme handbook and the practice learning portfolio.

Documentary evidence confirms changes are made to programme documentation to meet SSSA requirements. Practice assessors, practice supervisors and academic assessors are responsible for supporting students in the practice learning environment. The programme documentation details their associated roles. Evidence





of practice learning and the progression towards achievement of the programme learning outcomes is recorded in a practice learning portfolio. There's a process for the allocation of practice supervisor, practice assessor and academic assessor.

There's evidence the practice supervisor, practice assessor and academic assessor document students' progress and are involved in supporting learning and confirming practice competencies are achieved. The practice learning portfolio requires evidence of three formative meetings with the student and the practice assessor; the practice supervisor can contribute directly to the meetings. The final assessment process includes collaboration between the practice assessor and academic assessor; this is undertaken by email, skype, telephone or in person. The practice assessor must complete a checklist confirming they've communicated with practice supervisors, service users and carers and others who have direct observation of students in practice. They must confirm how they communicate with the academic assessor in relation to student performance and achievement. The practice supervisor comments on student performance in the practice learning portfolio and is encouraged to meet regularly with the practice accessor. Service users and carers provide anonymised feedback on student performance using a patient evaluation form.

The academic assessor completes a checklist to confirm the programme requirements are met and communication with the practice assessor has occurred.

Programme documentation provides evidence of a consistent approach ensuring sound communication process and details how communication is undertaken between practice supervisors, practice assessors and the academic assessor.

The senior academic lead confirms there's no current students who will be transferring to the SSSA.

Programme providers must provide evidence at programme approval that resources are currently available to support programme intentions.

What we found:

There's an experienced academic as programme lead who is a member of the SPQ DN programme team. There's sufficient academic staff with a SPQ DN qualification to support the programme. There is however recruitment underway to employ additional staff who have community nursing experience. In light of the changes this will be monitored to ensure the resources continue to effectively deliver the programme. (Recommendation one) (SFNME R2.14)

The academic programme team have recorded teacher qualifications and specialist qualifications, including V100 prescribing.

Evidence presented in the GM postgraduate workforce group SSSA sub-group meeting confirms associated PLPs, commissioners and MMU's intention to support the implementation and resources to support the SSSA.





Monitoring of the effectiveness of the practice learning environments and compliance with the SSSA continue to be undertaken by MMU in partnership with PLPs.
