Summary

Summary of modification request

The University of Chester (UoC), an approved education institution (AEI), is approved to deliver the specialist practitioner qualification district nursing (SPQ DN) with mandatory integrated V100 nurse prescribing programme since re-approval in 2013. The current programme is approved until the end of August 2020.

The UoC presented documentation for a major modification to transfer from the Standards to support learning and assessment in practice (SLAiP) (NMC, 2008) to the Standards for student supervision and assessment (SSSA) (NMC, 2018) within the current approved SPQ DN programme.

Documentary evidence confirms the programme team has engaged with students, service users and practice learning partners (PLPs) to consider this modification. The associated PLPs and north west practice education group (NWPEG) support the proposed changes to practice supervision and assessment to meet the SSSA. There are four AEIs in the Cheshire and Merseyside (C and M) university consortium which include UoC. The consortium has an established collaborative relationship in developing shared systems to ensure NMC approved programmes comply with regulatory standards. The consortium, in collaboration with practice learning partners (PLPs) agree to transfer all students to the SSSA from September 2019.

The supervisors and assessors' subgroup from the C and M curriculum and validation group have developed guidance, role descriptors and supporting information on the SSSA. Documentary evidence confirms there are clear and comprehensive arrangements in place to prepare practice supervisors, practice assessors and academic assessors for their new roles to meet the SSSA from September 2019.

Resources and governance processes are in place to support the programme and practice learning and assessment in practice are in place. The SSSA are met at programme level.

The modification is recommended to the NMC for approval.

What we found:

The common core learning outcomes are unchanged since the original approval in 2013. The supervision and assessment process to support students to achieve the outcomes in practice learning have been changed to meet the SSSA.

The C and M university consortium has an established collaborative relationship in developing shared documents which include practice supervisor, practice assessor and academic assessor roles and preparation materials.

The UoC provides generic preparation and guidance for the roles of practice supervisor, practice assessor and academic assessor. There are specific programme handbooks at academic level six and seven and practice assessment documentation which are updated to identify the roles and responsibilities of the practice supervisor, practice assessor and academic assessor. There is only one part to the SPQ DN programme with the practice assessor and academic assessor the same person throughout.

Documentary evidence states the practice assessor is a registered nurse with suitable equivalent qualifications for the programme the student is undertaking. Evidence confirms all intended academic assessors must have appropriate specialist practitioner qualifications and experience. Additionally, they must have or be working towards a recognised teaching qualification (postgraduate certificate) and have or be working towards fellowship of the higher education academy.

Preparation workshops for practice assessors and supervisors are delivered to all PLPs on a rolling programme basis during July and early September 2019. These workshops will now become a part of each PLP's existing mandatory annual training. The SSSA will be introduced through each PLP's monthly mandatory update session in partnership with the UoC. This will enable monitoring of progress and introduce new staff to the SSSA and facilitate ongoing development. Academic links in practice (ALPs) will be working in collaboration with the PEFs to deliver the workshops and





support and monitor progress.

All existing DN practice teachers will be informed of the changes and be invited to a practice assessor workshop in early September. These practice assessor workshops will be open to both practice supervisors and practice assessors of the SPQ DN programme and will be available at the start of each programme cohort.

There is a cross-AEI online practice assessment record and evaluation system (OPARE) that is adapted in preparation for the implementation of the SSSA. This will record and monitor the number practice supervisors and practice assessors in each practice learning area.

Academic staff prepared as academic assessors will visit students in practice learning areas each semester to meet the SSSA requirements. The meetings will be recorded within the student's portfolio. The academic assessor will work collaboratively with the student's nominated practice supervisor and practice assessor to discuss student conduct, proficiency and achievement.

Current students on the programme agree to transfer to the SSSA. They will attend a half day workshop to introduce them to the SSSA. Any student who is on interrupted study will transfer to the SSSA on their return. They will receive a session to introduce them to the SSSA. The programme team plan to provide newly qualified SPQs with a two- day workshop to prepare them to become practice supervisors and assessors.
